The AUN was formed to address the need for the region to quickly develop a regional identity and solidarity while promoting the fostering of ASEAN talents by creating a platform to allow the region's leading higher education institutions to collaborate. From 1995 until now, the AUN has remained firmly committed to the mission that was set out in the preamble to its charter.

Today, the AUN is a network widely recognised as a vital mechanism for the build-up of an active and renowned ASEAN community in higher education. Given such importance, the AUN was highly commended by the Meeting of Ministers for Education in ASEAN countries for its achievements in upgrading the capacity of ASEAN human resources and enhancing the quality of education at the AUN member universities. # **Deploy AUN-QA to Elevate Quality Standard of HEIs in ASEAN**

#### **IQA System Design and Development**

Higher education is the foundation for social, economic, and political development, where a country's growth is dependent on the skills of its workers. Good quality higher education is only ensured when its internal systems are self-facilitating and sustainable. Such requisitions call for the need of excellent Internal Quality Assurance (IQA) systems with the capacity to instill a quality culture on academic staff and quality assurance processes.

In establishing an effective implementation of the integrative framework, the Internal Quality Assurance (IQA) Development Workshop brought together IQA experts from the ASEAN region and the International Network for Quality Assurance Agencies (INQAAHE) with the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam (hereby referred to as Viet Nam) as the genesis site. Extensive research, workshops, and discussions on IQA models and regulations related to quality standardisation in higher education among ASEAN countries were conducted with input from stakeholders, experts, and experienced users to formulate the AUN-QA IQA System, with particular emphasis on the customisation and implementation of the system in Higher Education Institutions in Viet Nam. The development of IQA within universities in the ASEAN region is critical to guaranteeing the production of qualified individuals for the community and beyond.























# **Drive Student Mobility through Curriculum Enhancement**

CALOHEA Project was launched under a collaboration between AUN and the Tuning Academy of the University of Groningen, the Netherlands. The project aims to ease the degree recognition process, facilitate inter- and intraregional student mobility, and drive internationalisation in ASEAN universities through 3 Recognition Mechanisms, namely:

- Regional Subject-Specific Qualifications and Assessment Reference Frameworks
  - Student Workload Measurement
  - Authentic Assessment of Programme Learning Outcomes

With the regained normalities after the pandemic, countries have now opened their borders for travel to commence and mobility programmes to continue. Apart from being a once-in-a-lifetime experience that can broaden one's perspective and deepen one's understanding of the world; student mobility serves as a bedrock for cross-cultural awareness, academic exchange, and the nurturing of global citizens.

With the three Recognition Mechanisms in place, higher education institutions, students, faculties, and non-academic staff can benefit from the standardised mechanism, the clear and specific common framework, and the increasing access to the international academic world.

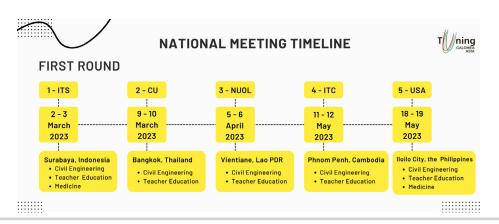


# **CALOHEA National Meetings**

The workshop was launched on 21-23 March 2023, with 22 Core and Associate Member Universities from 8 countries across ASEAN participating.















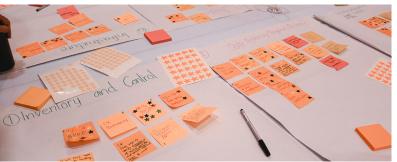


























# **Times Higher Education Master Class on Data Management and Submission**

AUN-SUN/SixERS Study and Visit Programme has become the annual student mobility programme in partnership between the AUN and the six Japanese universities under the "SUN/ SixERS" consortium. The unique two-week programme consists of several activities, such as 1) unique lectures, 2) hands-on workshops, 3) site visits, 4) cultural exposures, and more exciting and engaging activities. Through these activities, students are to be informed of the historical importance of knowledge transmission, cultural values, and customs in building a strong and resilient community ripe with an authentic cultural identity. The theme of this year is set to be: To learn and unlearn: An exploration through time. AUN-Harbour Education Study and Visit Programme offers thirty students from China a tailor-made opportunity to learn and experience ASEAN and to explore its diversity while learning in-depth knowledge in various aspects through lectures, on-site exposures, cultural workshops and organisation visits. # Academic Scholarships



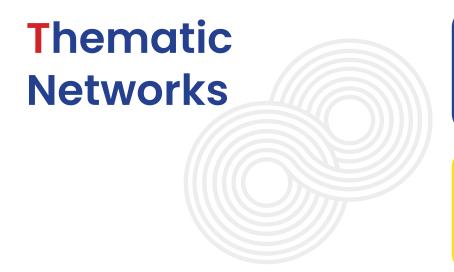
Academic scholarship programmes under the steering wheel of the AUN and its distinguished higher education partners continue to provide support and opportunity for students, academics, and researchers in their academic pursuits. - ASEAN-China Young Leaders Scholarship (ACYLS) is an initiative in response to the call of the Leaders of the People's Republic of China (PRC) and ASEAN Member States (AMS) to increase people-to-people exchanges, strengthen educational cooperation, and promote academic exchanges and linkages between AMS and the PRC. It aims to foster socio-cultural and people-to-people exchanges to build a closer ASEAN-China community with a shared future. The AUN serves as a regional coordinator for the programme, overseeing the application and nomination of candidates who are academics and scholars from the ASFAN countries.
- China-AUN Scholarship is a scholarship programme under the ASEAN-China Academic Cooperation and Exchange Programme in cooperation with the China Scholarship Council (CSC) with the financial support of the Ministry of Education of the PRC. Initiated in 2008, this programme offers 30 full scholarships annually to citizens of ASEAN member countries to pursue their Master's and Doctoral degrees in China.
- ASEAN University Network-Human Rights Education (AUN-HRE) PhD scholarships for students from Myanmar is under AUN-HRE, hosted by Mahidol University (MU). Realising that human rights and fundamental freedoms are key principles for ASEAN communitybuilding, AUN-HRE strives to place human rights and peace high on the educational and research agendas with the vision to see the culture and values of human rights, peace and democracy are instilled through widespread research and teaching in higher education in Southeast Asia.
- ASEAN University Network Disability Public Policy Network (AUN-DPPnet) Scholarship is under AUN-DPPnet, hosted by Universiti Malaya (UM). AUN-DPPnet is an AUN Thematic Network with specialization in promoting a cadre of disability policy leaders who will contribute to the vision of an ASEAN region that is inclusive, barrier-free and rights-based. Supported by Nippon Foundation, Japan, the scholarship programme is intended for students admitted to universities that are members of the AUN in a study related to a master's degree in disability public policy.

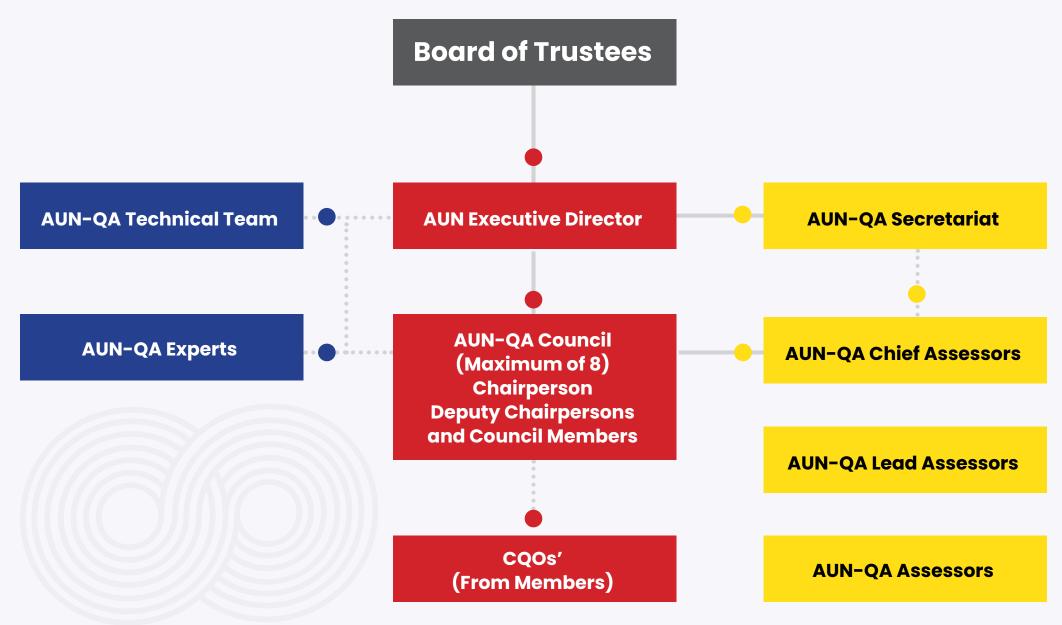

The ASEAN University Network–Quality Assurance (AUN–QA) Network was created to realise the mission of harmonising educational standards and seeking continuous improvement of academic quality of universities in the ASEAN region. AUN–QA activities are carried out in accordance with the Bangkok Accord adopted in 2000, which provides a series of guidelines to promote the development of a quality assurance system as instruments for maintaining, improving and enhancing teaching, research and the overall academic standards of AUN member universities. Since the establishment of the Bangkok Accord in 2000, AUN–QA has been actively promoting, developing, and implementing quality assurance practices based on an empirical approach where quality assurance practices are shared, tested, evaluated, and improved.

To accomplish its mission, AUN-QA conducts quality assessments for Higher Education Institutions that are members of its network. These assessments include the AUN-QA Programme Assessment and the AUN-QA Institutional Assessment. It also conducts other activities including capacity building, outreach programmes and knowledge management and enabling systems for its members and resource persons. These include the organisation of regional and international conferences, calibration workshops for AUN-QA Assessors, training services, remote learning services, and policy meetings.

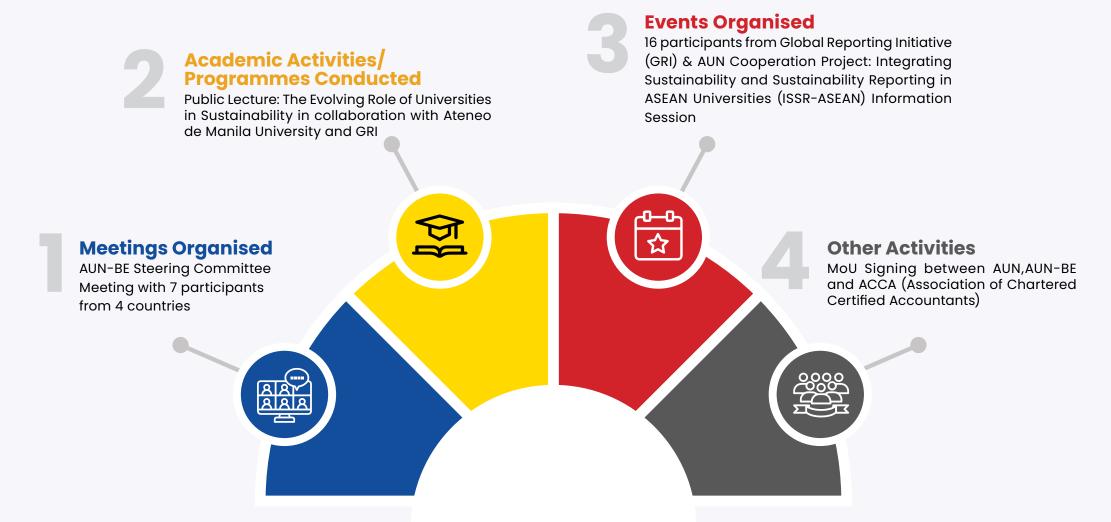

The ASEAN University Network/Southeast Asia Engineering Education Development Network (AUN/SEED-Net) was established in 2001 as a sub-network under the auspices of AUN to promote human resource development in engineering for the sustainable socio-economic development of the ASEAN region.

Full-scale operation of the AUN/SEED-Net Project started in 2003 with support from the Japanese Government through Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), Japanese Supporting University (JSU), which after Phase IV, developed into a new function known as Japanese Partner University (JPU), ASEAN Member State (AMS), and AUN/SEED-Net Member Institution (MI). AUN/SEED-Net has succeeded in developing and strengthening its academic engineering network among ASEAN region and beyond.

Based on the remarkable achievements, JICA, JSU/JPU, AMS, MI, and AUN are determined to continue AUN/SEED-Net after the end of Phase IV which is the final phase of full-scale operation. During the Post-Phase, AUN/SEED-Net will be transferred to AUN to build a structure that will continue to be the connecting hub between ASEAN and Japan. The key milestones are as follows:

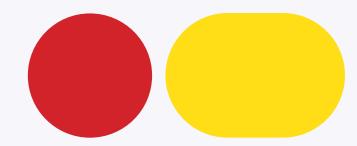

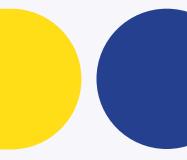

The Libraries of ASEAN University Network (AUNILO) is a thematic network that serves as a platform for academic resource sharing, information exchange, and networking among the academic libraries of AUN Member Universities and academic communities in the ASEAN region through an online resource sharing system. This initiative was taken as AUN members became aware of the increasing role of information and communications technology (ICT) in national development.

AUNILO continues its collaborative work in strengthening the network among its Member Universities and improving each one's access to information and various resources for the increasing developmental needs of our nations and the impactful globalised role that technology plays in our society.

The AUNILO working committee held their first meeting in Singapore in 2004 to reaffirm the collective will of Member Universities to promote information networking in ASEAN. Universiti Sains Malaysia Library served as the first AUNILO Secretariat to coordinate activities and encourage collaboration among its Member Libraries. In 2018, the AUNILO Secretariat was moved to the Philippines, with responsibility shared between the Ateneo de Manila University, De La Salle University, and University of the Philippines.

From 2023, National University of Singapore, Nanyang Technological University and Singapore Management University will assume the role of the AUNILO Secretariat for a period of three years and will focus on the theme of capacity building by leveraging digital platforms and exploring opportunities that promote cross-thematic cooperation amongst the various AUN networks.

The ASEAN Credit Transfer System (ACTS) was initiated by the ASEAN University Network with the primary objective of facilitating student and academic mobility in the ASEAN region. The system has been managed by the AUN-ACTS Secretariat which has been hosted by Universitas Indonesia since 2010.

#### What is ACTS?

ACTS comprises three components:

- Grading scales
- Online list of available courses
- Online application system

### ACTS is a modified version, user-friendly, of the credit transfer system.

- The ACTS will be a student-centered system based on students' workload in terms of the learning outcome.
- The ACTS will be applicable to student mobility and exchange in the general duration of one, up to the maximum of two academic semesters, or a shorter period of study (for example, a summer semester) if deemed necessary.
- The ACTS will take into account the existing institutional and national credit systems for the expression and conversion of credits, study periods and learning outcome achievements.
- The ACTS will not require a modification of the existing institutional or national credit systems.

### **Project Inception**

The differences between the various credit systems in the ASEAN region are considered as one of the main obstacles to the mobility and exchange of students within the region. The AEC Thematic Network has been established to serve as a platform to promote collaborative research between academic, industry, government agencies, and relevant organisations in support of policy making focusing on ASEAN Economic Community related issues.

### **Objectives**

- To strengthen research collaboration between ASEAN universities and the industrial sector on issues pertinent to the AEC and the deepening of economic integration within ASEAN
- To facilitate the exchange of experts between ASEAN universities and the industrial sector that can facilitate a deeper understanding of the AEC in each ASEAN member country

The first AEIF was held on 21 May 2015 at Oxford University, United Kingdom; the second AEIF at the Institute of Diplomacy and Foreign Relations (IDFR), Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, 2016; the third and fourth AEIF was held in 2017 and 2019 in collaboration with UNESCAP at the United Nations Conference Centre in Bangkok. 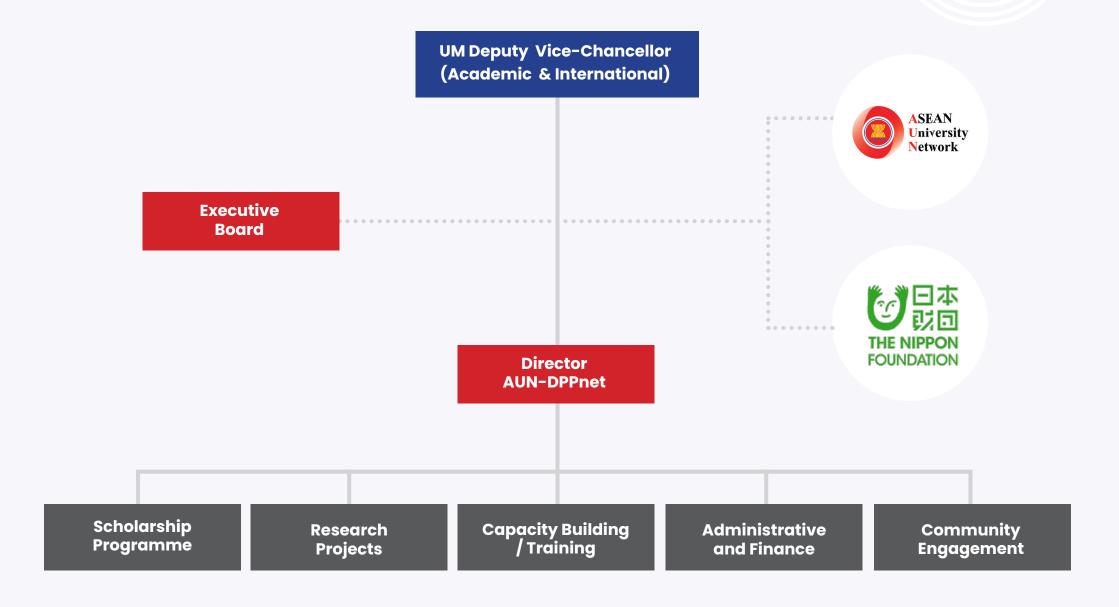

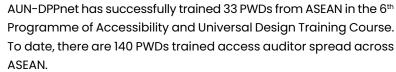
# **Organisation Structure**

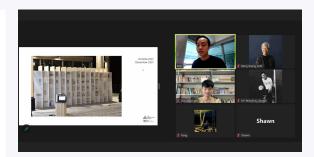

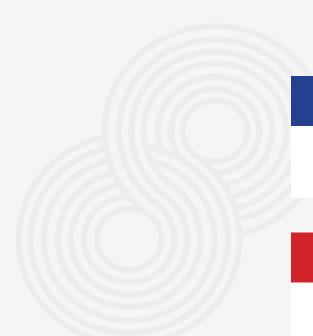

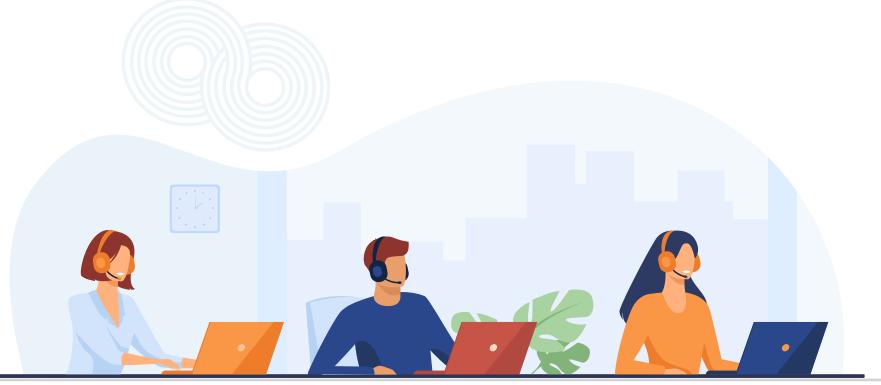
