



**Recommendations of
The First ACCESS Dialogue Event
“Student Involvement in University Management - An Interregional
Dialogue”**

**Bangkok
1-3 February 2010**

At the First Academic Cooperation Europe-South East Asia Support (ACCESS) Dialogue Event on “Student Involvement in University Management” hosted by Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, the following recommendations have been drawn up by university executives for student affairs and student representatives from AUN Member Universities in order to present their perspectives on the enhancement of students’ involvement opportunities in university management;

The participants of the First ACCESS Dialogue Event agreed to:

- recognise students as competent, active and constructive key stakeholders of the university;
- continue and expand the existing network of cooperation in both the local and international levels in order to provide a platform for both executives for student affairs and student representatives to discuss and share their views to improve student participation in university management;
- recognise the importance of student participation, whether direct or indirect, in the university policy making process in order for students to express their views;
- facilitate student engagement in the university management;
- encourage dialogue between university management executives and student representatives on a regular basis;
- encourage the university to provide resources to support student development in relation to student participation in university management; and
- request the ASEAN Governments to foster and support the engagement and cooperation among student leaders and representatives within the ASEAN region and beyond.

The Recommendation paper on “Student Involvement in University Management” shall be delivered to ASEAN related meetings and respective international bodies for consideration to generate concrete assistance for viability of implementation.
