The ASEAN University Network (AUN) Internship Programme offers students worldwide an opportunity to intern at the AUN Secretariat office in Bangkok, Thailand.

As an AUN intern, you will gain hands-on experience working alongside officers on higher education projects in Southeast Asia.

Who can become the AUN Interns?

If you're a university student with a thirst for knowledge, proficient in English, and adept at Microsoft/Google suites, you qualify! Whether you're passionate about project management, love diving into research, or have a knack for effective communication, there's a place for you at AUN.

Scope of Responsibilities

As an AUN intern, the student will be assigned tasks which contribute optimally to the operation and high-impact success of AUN's platforms, projects and activities. The variety of tasks and assignments for AUN Interns can be categorized as follows:

Project Management

Contribute to the network's project management and organization in the aspects of logistics and project or event organization as student liaisons or assistants to AUN Programme Officers-in-charge.

Communications and Publications

Ideate and write news articles, reports and publications to showcase, document and raise awareness of AUN impacts and activities.

Subject-Specific Research

Conduct subject-specific research on higher education and any other relevant topics.

Creative and High-Impact Media

AUN Internship: Programme Description

BACKGROUND

The ASEAN University Network (AUN) Internship Programme was first proposed at the 23rd AUN Board of Trustees (AUN-BOT) Meeting on 19-20 June 2008 in Hanoi, introducing a new opportunity for ASEAN university students to apply their educational skills and promote their own professional and personal growth through internship at a prominent ASEAN agency working towards the region's development of higher education. Following a request by the board to revise the details of the project proposal, the AUN Internship Programme was officially endorsed and launched at the 24th AUN-BOT Meeting on 30 - 31 January 2009 in Brunei Darussalam.



For over a decade, the AUN Internship Programme has been offering motivated and academically accomplished international students an opportunity to work in a regional organization that aims to build a strong foundation for higher education cooperation in the ASEAN region. As an AUN intern, the student will have the opportunity to gain valuable hands-on experience in interregional cooperation, project management and communications, working closely with experienced staff and experts in the field of ASEAN higher education.

Ultimately, the programme alumni will graduate with intensive experience and skills essential for pursuing their future careers, with particular focus on enhancing their capabilities to work in a multicultural and intergovernmental environment, including:

Team Work



Cross-Cultural Skills



Strategic Thinking



In addition to capacity building, AUN interns will get to establish life-long personal and professional connections with their international peers and higher education professionals whom they meet along the way. ABOUT AUN

ASEAN University Network (AUN) was established in 1995 under the auspices of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) with the primary objective to strengthen and expand cooperation among leading universities in ASEAN. For almost three decades, AUN has continually conducted a wide range of activities through fostering solidarity among ASEAN scholars and academicians, developing academic and professional human resources, conducting educational and cultural youth activities and enabling the dissemination of information among ASEAN academic community as well as among its Dialogue Partners.

The AUN Secretariat falls under the Human Development Directorate of the ASEAN Sócio-Cultural Community Department (ASCC Department) of the ASEAN Secretariat. The AUN Secretariat serves as a small taskforce under AUN working to promote interconnectivity and collaborations between the network's core university members, associate members, organizations and stakeholders within and outside of the ASEAN region in multiple fronts. The scope of work conducted by the AUN Secretariat requires multidisciplinary contributions from its officers as well as stakeholders involved to conduct and deliver their work in the multicultural and interconnected environment of ASEAN higher education.

As agreed at the Workshop of the AUN Member Universities "Strategic Directions towards ASEAN Community 2015" on 2-3 November, 2007 AUN would enhance its role as the instrument for ASEAN to promote professional human resource development and to foster the awareness of ASEAN regional identity. Since the scope of the work by the AUN Secretariat already possesses high potential as a capacity building ground for interested ASEAN students who wish to learn about international development, governance and collaborations, the network's thought leaders at the time came up with the ideas of establishing a programme tailored for the region's young talents to join and learn by doing and involving themselves in the multifaceted work of AUN.

WHO CAN BECOME AUN INTERNS?

The AUN Internship programme welcomes current undergraduate and graduate students from certifiable universities anywhere in the world. The applicants may apply to the programme independently or through a sending institution.

The eligibility of the applicants requires the following qualities:



The AUN Internship Programme is open for applications all year round. Interested students are welcome to apply at any time, regardless of their institution's academic calendar. Accepted interns may participate during an active semester at their home university, pending further discussion with the AUN Secretariat to ensure they can fully engage with the programme while managing their ongoing academic responsibilities. By being open year-round, the programme provides increased flexibility for interested students to find an internship period that fits their schedule.

The AUN Internship Programme is not credit-bearing by nature. However, in the case that the intern would like to attend this programme as a credited part of their active curriculum, the AUN Secretariat can arrange for the intern's accreditation in collaboration with the intern's sending university, institution or organization.

PROGRAMME DURATION

The internship period at the AUN Secretariat is cascaded into three batches throughout the year:

Batch 1
(January to April)

Batch 2
(May to August)

Batch 3
(September to December)

MODES OF INTERNSHIP

There are two modes of internship programmes available:

1. Onsite Internship

Onsite Internship is conducted at the AUN Secretariat office, located in Chulalongkorn University near the central area of the Pathumwan district in Bangkok, Thailand. Serving as the heart of the university network's operation, this is where the intern will get to directly engage in real-world projects and work alongside experienced AUN officers in the network's implementative work to promote ASEAN higher education.

2. Remote Internship

Originally adopted during the COVID-19 pandemic when cross-border movement and activities were restricted, the AUN Internship Programme now offers an alternative option for interns who wish to participate in the programme remotely.

This mode of internship offers our interns high flexibility to join the internship programme even during their active semester.



SCOPE OF WORK

AUN Interns will fulfill their roles by providing their work and services in four dimensions, each with its own expected tasks and responsibilities:



The intern may be assigned to attend conferences that the AUN Secretariat and its unit were invited to or deemed beneficial by their supervisors. Possible assignments in this area include:

- Logistical Assistance
- Student Liaison
- Minutes Taking

The intern may be requested to write report articles on projects or events to be featured on the AUN Website and AUN E-newsletter. Possible assignments in this area include:

- Communications and writing
- Write news and research article
- Contribute to the development of AUN publications





The intern is regularly assigned to conduct research on a topic related to higher education. Possible assignments in this area include:

- Plan, develop and conduct subject-specific research
- Conduct their research presentations to the AUN Secretariat team and, potentially, the AUN Executive Director



For the interns with great skills in media and graphic designing, they will be offered the opportunity to plan and create high-impact visual and video materials to support the network's programmes, projects and activities. Possible assignments in this area include:

- Create communications materials, media and infographics for AUN activities



In fulfilling tasks and assignments in each area, the AUN interns will be working alongside the officers who are experienced in their respective department of the secretariat. In this regard, the interns will not only learn first-hand experience from the professionals in different areas, but they will also get to train and grow by working and delivering results of their own planning and execution. Their progress and contribution to the secretariat will be monitored and recorded for final evaluation at the end of their internship, with comments and feedback provided by their supervisors and officers whom they get to work with in certain tasks or assignments.

On some rare occasions, AUN interns might have the opportunity to join and participate in domestic and/or oversea missions.

EVALUATION AND CERTIFICATION

The evaluation process of the AUN Internship Programme is two-way, enabling both the interns and the officers to participate. To explain, the intern will be required to complete an evaluation form to provide feedback on the AUN Internship Programme and to offer suggestions for improvement. The supervisors will be required to evaluate the performance and work undertaken by the intern.

Upon their successful completion of the internship programme, the AUN Secretariat will provide a certificate of competency to the intern according to the intern's overall performance.

SUSTAINABILITY AND IMPACT

Through mutual benefits and collaboration between the AUN Secretariat team and the interns, the AUN Internship Programme has established a sustainable cycle of achievements and impact that goes beyond just internship completion and certification.



AUN Interns

2. Networking and building long-term relationship with peers

4. Ensuring enriched learning and training experience for the intern's personal and professional growth.

Programme Management Details

PROGRAMME MANAGEMENT DETAILS

The AUN Internship Programme involves **three key stakeholders** in the processes under the cycle of the programme, namely:

- (1) Students;
- (2) Sending Agencies/Institutions/Universities; and
- (3) the AUN Secretariat.

Each of these actors comes with their own role and responsibilities to fulfill.

Actors	Roles and Responsibilities
Student Interns	Application and Preparation - Complete the application form and provide necessary documents to complete the process. - In the case of successful application, confirm availability and participation in the programme via the Agreement and Conditions Form. During the Internship - Fulfill the tasks assigned by AUN Intern Supervisors to the best of their abilities. - If requested, travel with officers at the secretariat to complete domestic and/or oversea missions. Post-Internship - Complete the feedback form upon completion of the internship programme
Student Interns Sending Agencies/ Institutions/ Universities	Programme Coordination & Monitoring Application and Preparation - Coordinate with the AUN Secretariat to prepare for the application and selection process, including the provision of all the documents and stipulations required by the sending agencies. - Submit a list of student candidates to the AUN Secretariat to begin the selection process. - For successful candidates, the sending agencies should provide help with the candidates' preparation for the programme. During the Internship - Monitor and provide support to the student interns under the agency's care. - Coordinate with the AUN Secretariat for monitoring and follow-up on the intern's progress and conditions.

Actors	Roles and Responsibilities
Student Interns Sending Agencies/ Institutions/ Universities	Programme Coordination & Monitoring Post-Internship • If required, participate in final evaluation and accreditation of student performance. Internship Support Arrangement Depending on each agency's stipulations, the agency may sort, arrange and provide support to the participation of the student intern under their care, especially for on-site interns. The list of possible forms of support include, but is not limited to: 1. Airfare costs to/from their country of origin; 2. Accommodation; and 3. Monthly allowances.
	Programme Coordination & Monitoring Application and Preparation • Prepare and manage the internship programme timeline, application procedures, selection criteria and other supporting materials, including: 1. AUN Internship Application Form and 2. AUN Internship Agreement and Conditions Form. • Select, nominate and finalize the admission of the AUN Secretariat. During the Internship • Provide orientation and an internship introduction package to the new interns. • Manage, arrange and distribute tasks to interns in coordination with officers in different departments. • Monitor the well-being, conditions and performance of the AUN interns. Post-Internship • Complete the evaluation of student intern performance and competence development. • Prepare and distribute individualized certificates to successful AUN interns. • If necessary, assist the sending universities and agencies with credit-bearing evaluation on their side. Internship Support Arrangement The AUN Secretariat must sort, arrange and provide support to the participation of the student intern under their care, especially for on-site interns.

APPLICATION, SELECTION AND NOMINATION PROCEDURES

The application of the AUN Internship Programme opens on a year-round basis for interested students and sending universities, agencies and institutions. Each round consists of 3 batches which occur throughout the year. The standard period of each internship batch is as follows:

- Batch 1 (January to April)
- Batch 2 (May to August)
- Batch 3 (September to December)

Each batch can accommodate 6 - 10 on-site and remote interns.

The procedural details of the programme's application, selection and nomination are as follows:

Application

There are two general cases in which the programme receives applicants:

- **Independent Student Applicants**

Independent Student Applicants are undergraduate and graduate students who apply to participate in the programme.

- **Students sent by Universities/Agencies/Institutions**

Through direct contact and coordination with the AUN Secretariat, universities, agencies and institutions may submit a list of candidates to join the AUN Internship Programme. In this case, additional stipulations and requirements may be established between the sending organizations and the AUN Secretariat.

The application process is completely online with information, including the programme details and the application guideline, available at www.aunsec.org.

The following list entails the documents which the applicants are required to prepare in the English Language and submit to the AUN Secretariat:

Selection

The selection process will be completed by the AUN Secretariat in consideration of each applicant's eligibility, availability, conditions as well as challenges based on the secretariat's set of selection criteria.

Nomination

Once the final list of internship candidates has been completed, the AUN Secretariat will contact successful applicants via email to confirm their availability and commitment to participate in the programme.

Once the initial confirmation stage is done, the AUN Secretariat will issue an email package containing the following documents and information:

1. Acceptance Letter
2. AUN Internship Agreement and Conditions Form
3. Internship Details, including starting date, supervisor details, etc.

Each candidate needs to complete and submit the AUN Internship Conditions and Agreement Form to the AUN Secretariat to officiate their participation and commitment to the programme.

In addition to the condition and agreement form, additional documents may be required from participants of the on-site internship and/or those sent by universities/agencies/institutions:

- Travel, accommodation and logistical details for visa and accommodation support (for on-site interns)
- Acceptance Letter
- Other required documents as stipulated by the sending universities/agencies/institutions

In the case that the candidate requires a visa to stay in Bangkok and join the programme on-site, the AUN Secretariat is happy to help facilitate the process.

The AUN Secretariat will maintain further collaboration with the interns and the sending organizations to ensure smooth procedures and transition towards the start of the internship.

ACTIVE INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME DETAILS

The AUN Internship programme features a series of standard procedures and activities which the intern will be asked to complete. The following is a comprehensive timeline of a standard AUN internship programme.



Orientation & Ice-breaking (First Week)

During the first week of the internship, AUN interns will be provided with an orientation session with their supervisors to introduce them to the organization as well as their role, responsibilities and other matters related to their internship at the AUN Secretariat.

This period also serves as a great opportunity for the interns to get to know one another as well as the officers whom you may get a chance to work alongside during their time at the AUN Secretariat.

Active Internship Period

This is the active period when AUN interns get to earn their learning experience and develop their skills through direct participation in projects, events and activities under the banner of AUN working alongside experienced professionals at the AUN Secretariat and, occasionally, the university network's partners and stakeholders.

All the task management, assignment and monitoring for AUN interns are handled by the programme's supervisors in coordination with officers-in-charge of the project, event or activity in which the interns have participated.

Evaluation (Last Week)

During the last week of internship, the learning and performance outcome of AUN interns will be evaluated against a rubric of competence development.

Certification (Post-Internship)

Following successful completion of the internship, every intern will receive a certificate signed by the AUN Executive Director. This document certifies the intern's participation in the programme as well as displays a set of the intern's demonstrated competences.

INTERNSHIP EXTENSION AND CANCELLATION

Flexibility in terms of internship duration at the AUN Secretariat goes beyond the standard internship period as stipulated in the intern's application. Based on a mutual agreement basis, both the AUN intern and the internship programme supervisors may consider extending – or canceling – the intern's programme duration at the AUN Secretariat.

- **Internship Extension**

If an AUN Intern wishes to extend their internship at the secretariat, they can consult with their supervisors for the authorization to continue working and training at the AUN Secretariat.

- **Internship Cancellation**

In the case that an AUN intern has not been able to fulfill their obligations, perform at an expected level or failed to demonstrate full commitment to the programme as stipulated in the programme's conditions and agreement form, the internship can be canceled in a mutual agreement between the intern and the supervisors of the programme.

INTERN TASK DISTRIBUTION AND MANAGEMENT

AUN Secretariat Internship Supervision Team

The AUN Secretariat has a team of intern supervisors specifically for the task management and distribution for interns during the programme – a highly critical aspect of ensuring high-impact and enriching experience for students who participate in this internship programme.

During the active internship period, AUN Internship Supervisors are responsible for managing interns' task distribution and assignment based on their availability, competences as well as specific areas of interest.

Task Distribution, Monitoring, and Evaluation by the Supervision Team

During the admission process, the AUN Internship Supervisor Team takes note of each intern's background, skills, competences and areas of interest as indicated in their application forms as well as in other supporting documents.

In this scenario, the team will distribute tasks and assignments to each intern based on such information, as well as constant feedback and conversation with the intern to ensure that the learning experience meets the intern's expectations, interest and satisfaction.

Monitoring of the intern's performance and capacity development will be handled by the supervisors in coordination with the officer(s) in charge of the project to which the intern has contributed. Once the task has been accomplished, it will be added onto the intern's individual list of achievements, categorized based on different areas of work as well as competences developed.

At the end of the internship, AUN Internship Supervisors will rate the intern's performance and achievements on a scale of 1-5 using the following AUN Internship Competence Development Criteria. This aforementioned evaluation rubric scale serves as a structured tool to assess interns' performance across key competencies.

Those achieving high ratings are acknowledged for demonstrating exceptional competency in such specific areas. At the end of the internship, the competences demonstrated will be included on the intern's individual certificate, written in line with the programme's list of expected internship competences as follows:

AUN Internship Competence Development Criteria	List of Expected AUN Internship Competences

In parallel, the AUN Interns will also be asked to complete an evaluation form to evaluate their own experience and performance committing to the AUN Internship Programme. The form also includes a set of questions with the aim to stimulate comments and feedback on different aspects of the AUN Internship Programme for benchmarking and improvement by the AUN Secretariat in the future.

The ultimate evaluation result is the official AUN Internship Certificate issued by the AUN Secretariat and signed by the AUN Executive Director. The certificate verifies the intern's successful participation and completion in the internship programme at the AUN Secretariat, and provides a comprehensive list of achievements and competencies developed by the intern.

INTERNSHIP SUPPORT AND WORK ENVIRONMENT

The AUN Secretariat has an established work environment and support plan ready to accommodate our interns, both on-site and online, to help them achieve their goals working to learn from and contribute to the high-impact work of AUN.

Communication Channels



WhatsApp

WhatsApp is used as an active and immediate channel for individual and group communication between interns and supervisors.



Zoom

Zoom is used to arrange and organize online meetings with the secretariat team, interns, as well as university partners and stakeholders of AUN.



Slack

The team uses Slack to create a pool of internal communication between interns and supervisors for office-related matters.

Equipments

The AUN Secretariat can provide some basic equipments and tools to support the on-site intern's participation in the programme.

- **Desktop and Laptop Computer**

While the AUN Secretariat recommends participants of the internship programme to use their own laptop computer, there are desktop computers available at the AUN Secretariat for the intern to use. The AUN Secretariat may also be able to lend an office laptop computer to the intern as well – one which the intern needs to return to the AUN Secretariat upon completion of their internship.

- **Free Wi-Fi**

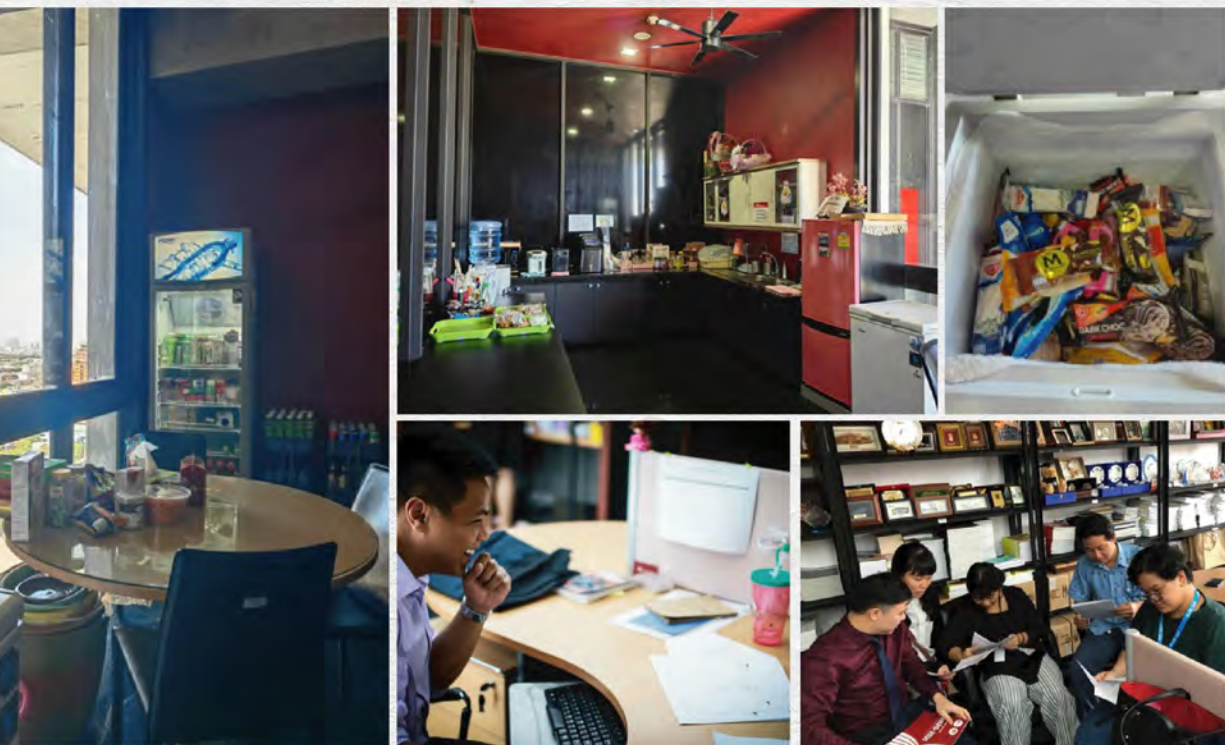
The AUN Secretariat Office offers free wifi to AUN interns. The office will provide the intern with the login information at the start of the internship.

The AUN Secretariat provides the on-site interns with co-working space for them to work and complete their assigned tasks together with their international peers as well as experienced AUN officers.

- **Meals & Snacks (On-site)**

The AUN Secretariat Office provides its officers as well as interns with free lunch from Monday to Thursday, should they come to work at the office. There are also snacks and beverages available in the pantry to help delight everyone's mood over the long day at work.

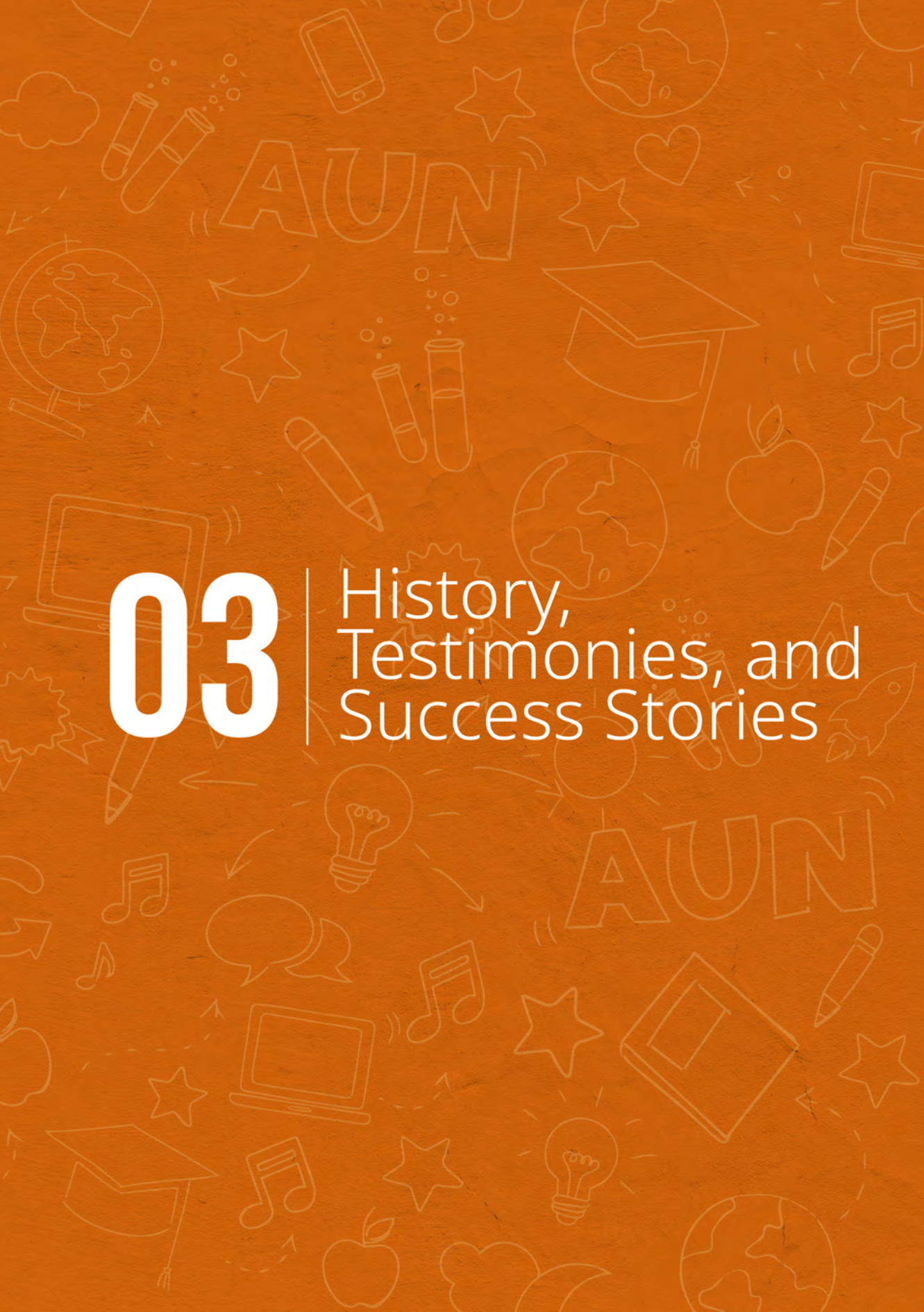


Logistical Arrangement Support (No Standard Financial Support and Allowance)

The AUN Secretariat does not provide any financial support to the intern participating in this programme. Hence, all the expenses in terms of visa acquisition, airfare, accommodation and other related costs must be borne by the interns or their sponsoring institutions.

However, if the intern is invited to accompany our AUN officers in a domestic or overseas mission, the AUN Secretariat will cover the cost of airfare, accommodation, transportation and meals in this matter. Likewise, in the case that the intern has to make their own commute to the site of the mission or activity, the intern may reimburse the transportation cost with the AUN Secretariat.

During the admission and preparation process, the AUN Secretariat will provide an information package which includes a list of recommended residences, local public transportations and other miscellaneous information that might be useful to help prepare the intern for their on-site participation in the programme.

AUN INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME TIMELINE

Officially launched in 2010, the AUN Internship Programme has been ongoing for over a decade, continuously offering accomplished and stimulating students from all over the globe to learn about international cooperation, project management and other areas of capacity building through the work of the AUN Secretariat. Throughout the course of the programme's history and development, there have been several points of significance showcasing both the challenges and the triumphs over the years.

Altogether, these highlighted points in the programme's timeline demonstrated just how far the AUN Internship Programme has come since its beginning while continuing forward into the future.



The Origin of AUN Internship Programme

What would become the AUN Internship Programme first came up during a workshop in 2007 where the ASEAN University Network (AUN) convened to discuss and set strategic direction for AUN's work and future role in achieving the ASEAN Community by 2015. In the efforts to link AUN roles to the ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community roadmaps, the network of universities was determined to help enhance the awareness of the sense and identity of ASEAN as a part of the network's mission in promoting professional human resource development in the region.

In response to relevant educational tasks, the AUN Secretariat initiated the credit non-bearing AUN Internship Programme Phase 1 to provide students with the opportunity to gain valuable experience and to apply their educational experience to the actual working environment. The Internship Programme also allows for ASEAN community involvement in the education of the young generation which will contribute to the enhancement of ASEAN Competitiveness. In this case, the interns could gain internship exposures with ASEAN or its related bodies located in their country of residence.

Following a year of planning and development, the AUN Internship Programme was first proposed at the 23rd AUN Board of Trustees (AUN-BOT) Meeting on 19-20 June 2008 in Hanoi, where a concrete discussion among the AUN Board of Trustees resulting in positive feedback and recommendations for the drafting of the programme's official planning as well as further study on implementing the concept of "traveling-classroom" into the internship module.





In light of the programme's first launch, AUN approached the ASEAN Secretariat and the ASEAN Foundation as its potential partners in tandem with the AUN Member Universities who helped facilitate the recruitment of the programme's first batch of student interns. It was not until 2011 when the AUN Secretariat welcomed the first intern of the programme to its office. From then on, the number of AUN interns continued to grow each year, and so did the variety of activities and assignments to help enrich their learning experience and capacity training during their time at the AUN Secretariat.

The Years of Global Expansion and Capacity Training

In the years following the launch of the programme, the AUN Secretariat continued to host student interns who initially came from AUN Member Universities across the ASEAN region. Throughout the programme, AUN interns are not assigned to do any miscellaneous tasks such as coffee brewing or photocopying – ones which we at the AUN Secretariat believe will only lead to mundane learning experience for the participants. Instead, AUN Interns are tasked with stimulating assignments to create impact and contribute to the work of the university network. Much of the AUN Interns' contributions have been delegated towards the roles of project management assistance, sub-specific research, communications and writing, and graphic and media production, supervised by experienced AUN officers in different departments at the secretariat.

Not long after, the programme's outreach extended beyond the ASEAN region, with the roster soon welcoming students from universities of Non-ASEAN countries, such as Germany, Hong Kong, China, and Japan at the earliest. Such expansion of the programme's cohorts of students greatly boosted the sociocultural diversity of each batch and enhanced the cross-cultural experience the interns will gain from interacting and working with one another.

It is not only the students who gain knowledge and capacity from this internship experience as the AUN Secretariat, as one of the region's leading implementation factors of higher education projects, also benefits from the continuous providing of this platform for the students worldwide. Through constant programme evaluation and improvement to ensure the interns' effectual and satisfactory learning experience, the officers at the AUN Secretariat can use the strategy, knowledge and framework from implementing this programme in other projects and activities related to the nurturing of students and young talents.



COVID-19 Pandemic Disruption and Adaptation

When the world was ravaged by the COVID-19 pandemic, the AUN Internship programme suffered the same fate as any other on-site activities during the age of quarantine and travel restrictions. Early 2020 saw the original format of the internship programme undergoing a complete overhaul to be able to cater to the needs and interest of our interns under the challenging circumstances at the time.

To support the programme's continuation, the AUN Internship Programme changed from its original on-site format to a full online programme. By leveraging social media and other online platforms to connect with our student participants, the AUN Secretariat continued to provide this platform for students from across the globe to continue to learn and work in an international relations and project management setting.

In 2020, when this mode of internship was first adopted, the AUN Secretariat was able to accommodate 23 online interns throughout the year. In this scenario, even though on-site activities became mostly impossible due to health and safety concerns, the programme remained steadfast in continuing to offer opportunities for the remote interns to participate in online ASEAN higher education platforms and activities.

While the AUN Secretariat found the continuation of this programme during this time to be challenging, it also served as a testing ground for the organization to find and implement new tools, methods and solutions for this internship programme to ensure its continuity. During such trying times, research task forces comprising AUN interns were crucial for the secretariat to keep up with new developments to the situation and how AUN can adapt and continue to deliver concrete results. In addition, with the AUN E-newsletter newly established at the time, the interns with interest as well as high capacity in writing and communication were offered an opportunity to contribute to the weekly online newsletter in the forms of news and subject-specific articles.

Despite all the trials and trepidations experienced, both the AUN Secretariat and the AUN interns strived to the challenges during the times and prevailed. The revision of the AUN Internship Programme's mode of work at the time also had a lasting effect on how the internship programme operated moving forward in the post-pandemic era.

Past achievements of AUN interns in this areas include:

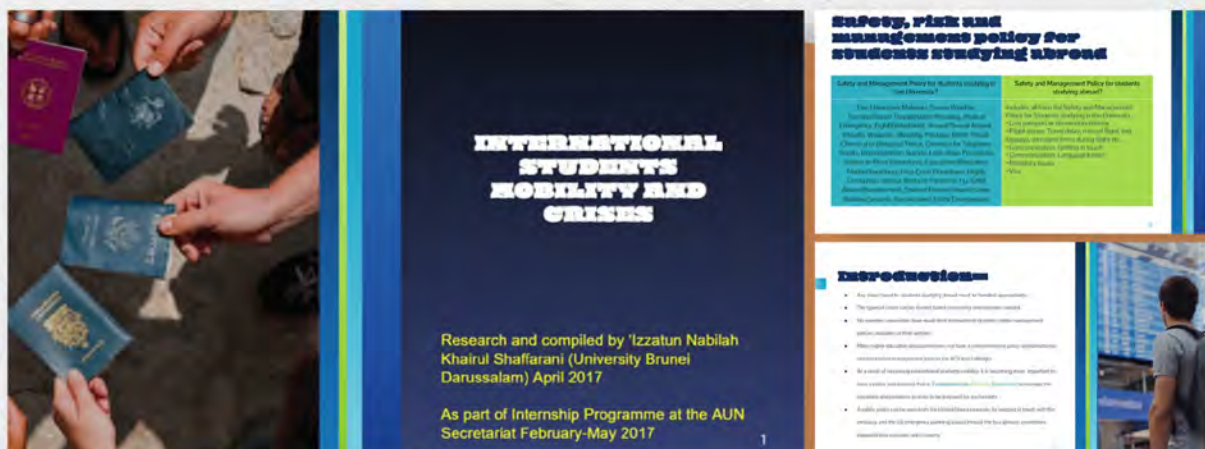
International Students Mobility and Crises

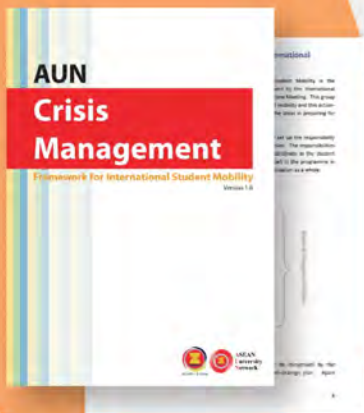

The presentation focused on managing student exchange activities and specifically examined the theme of "International Student Mobility and Crises." This theme was explored at the 2017 ASEAN +3 Heads of International Relations Meeting hosted by Ateneo de Manila University.

As AUN is one of the key facilitators of student exchange programmes in the region, the AUN Secretariat organized this meeting to discuss best practices and policies regarding the safety, risk management, and crisis response related to international student mobility. Specific crises highlighted included natural disasters, political instability, health epidemics, and other major events that could impact exchanged students.

In addition, the presentation also touched on crisis preparedness policies and protocols that universities have or should have in place to protect visiting students in the event of an emergency. Recommendations for multilevel crisis management plans involving both host universities and students' home institutions were also discussed.

This group work demonstrates that AUN interns do not only complete individual assignments, but also collaborate in teams. Working in groups enables them to learn how to work effectively with others.



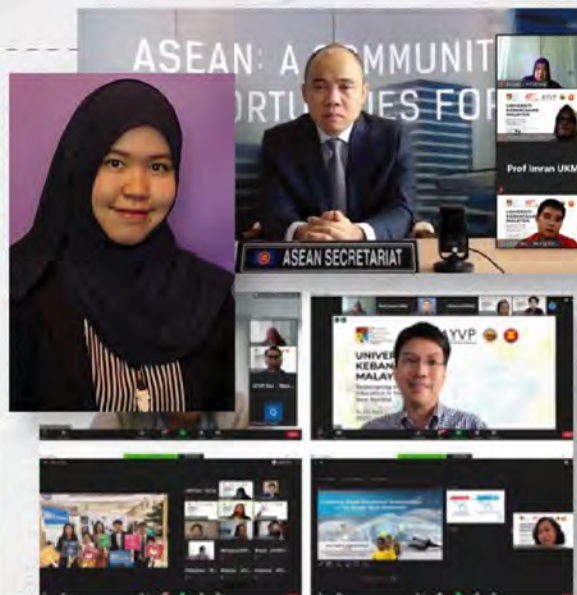
Participation in Higher Education Projects and Activities in a Multicultural and International Setting

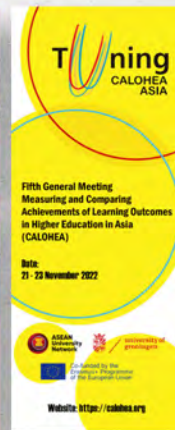
